## Demographics and Retention Rates for Fall 2017, 2018, and 2019 And Graduation Rates for Fall 2016 and 2014 Beginners Participating in the Student Support Services Program (SSS)

Student Support Services at IUPUI (SSS), part of the TRIO program, is designed to provide programming and support to select first-generation students from low income backgrounds (SSS, 2019). The program provides academic advising, free academic tutoring, financial aid counseling, financial literacy training, and mentoring for participants beginning at Orientation and continuing throughout their career at IUPUI.

Tables below provide demographic and academic characteristics as well as retention and GPA information for first-time beginners who participated in SSS compared to non-participants who were first generation and received a Pell Grant in their first year from the Fall 2017, Fall 2018, and Fall 2019 cohorts. Graduation rates from the 2016 cohort (4-year) and 2014 cohort (6-year) are also included. Highlights include the following:

- Seventy-three percent of Fall 2019 SSS participants were retained at the Indianapolis campus compared to 68% of first generation Pell recipients who did not participate in SSS. Fall 2019 beginners who participated in SSS were slightly more likely to be retained with a GPA greater than 2.0 (67% of SSS participants compared to 58% of students who did not participate in any program).
- Fall 2019 beginners in SSS also earned a slightly higher GPA in their first fall semester than similar students who did not participate in SSS (2.47 for SSS students compared to 2.37 for non-SSS students).
- Similarly, in Fall 2018, beginners who participated in SSS were slightly more likely to be retained into their second year at the Indianapolis campus than first generation Pell recipients who did not participate (67% for SSS participants compared to 60% of those that did not participate).
- Fall 2017 SSS participants were about as likely to be retained into their third year at IUPUI as first generation beginners receiving a Pell Grant from the same cohort.
- SSS participants from the Fall 2016 cohort were less likely to graduate in four years from IUPUI and had earned a slightly lower cumulative GPA than first generation Pell recipients who did not participate in SSS. However, SSS participants from the Fall 2014 cohort were slightly more likely to graduate from IUPUI in six years than non-participants.
