2014 IUPUI CONTINUING STUDENT SURVEY SUMMARY REPORT FOR IUPUC

AREAS OF STRENGTH AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR IMPROVEMENT

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November 2014

INTRODUCTION

The IUPUI Continuing Student Satisfaction and Priorities Survey was originally commissioned in 1993 by the Vice Chancellor for Planning and Institutional Improvement with the intention of collecting representative data about students' satisfaction with their experiences at IUPUI. Since its inception, the survey has grown to incorporate items addressing the Principles of Undergraduate Learning (PUL's), IUPUI's Climate for Diversity, and student employment. The most recent revision in 2010 also included items designed to assess student participation in opportunities associated with the RISE initiative. The survey was generated and administered by the Office of Student Data, Analysis, and Evaluation (OSDAE) in collaboration with administrative and academic leaders across IUPUI.

In spring 2014, 6,141 undergraduate students received an e-mail which included both an invitation to participate in the Continuing Student Survey as well as an individual link to the survey itself. A total of 873 students responded to the survey for a response rate of 14.2%. The respondents included 206 students from IUPUC. Demographic and academic characteristics of IUPUC respondents and all respondents appear in tables 1 and 2.

The following is a report of respondents whose primary campus as of spring 2014 was IUPUC. In order to demonstrate the extent of the difference between the scale means of schools and the scale mean for all IUPUI respondents, effect sizes were generated. Effect sizes represent the number of standard deviation units between the school and campus means. In general, an effect size of less than 0.2 of a standard deviation is seen as "trivial," between 0.2 and 0.49 of a standard deviation is "small," between 0.5 and 0.79 is "medium," and larger than 0.8 is "large". All items for which the effect size is at least 0.2 standard deviations above the mean for all IUPUI students are labeled as "Areas of Strength", while items where the effect size is at least -0.2 standard deviations below the mean are labeled as "Opportunities for Improvement". 




Figure 2 Hours per Week Spent Studying

Figure 3 Z-Scores of Importance and Satisfaction Ratings of Faculty and Instruction




Figure 4 Z-Scores of Importance and Satisfaction Ratings of Advising and Other Academic Services





Figure 5 Effect Sizes of Importance and Satisfaction Ratings of the Learning Environment



Figure 7 Z-scores of Importance and Satisfaction of Registering for Classes and Financial Aid




Figure 8 Z-scores of Importance and Satisfaction of Student Affairs Services





Figure 9 Z-scores of Importance and Satisfaction Campus Safety





Figure 10 What is your marital status?
