Welcome to the 2017 IUPUI School of Dentistry Entering Student Survey Report

The Entering Student Survey is a yearly survey administered during the first day of a student's orientation. The students are given the link to the survey during a dedicated block of time to ensure they have enough time to complete the survey. The survey is not required to be filled out, but students it is encouraged as some responses may be used to ensure they get information to resources to help them succeed in college. Of the 99 premajor School of Dentistry beginning freshmen in the 2017 cohort, 61 completed the Entering Student Survey. That is a response rate of 61%.

IUPUI's Vision

To be a leading urban research institution recognized for the success of its students, its advances in health and life sciences, and its intellectual, economic, and cultural contributions to the well-being of the citizens of Indianapolis, the state of Indiana, and beyond.

Key Highlights Overall

- Compared to all other pre-major students, School of Dentistry pre-major students were less likely to rate themselves high compared to other students in academic and mathematical ability, more likely to spend more hours commuting to class, more likely to get tutoring or peer mentoring help in specific courses and enroll in courses during summer, more likely to attend IUPUI because of the size of IUPUI, wanting to live near home, and their parents/relatives wanted them to attend.
- 97% of Dentistry respondents agree that the IUPUI campus is welcoming.
- 55% of direct-admit respondents reported that being a hard worker is 'Very much like me.'
- Dentistry direct-admit respondents rated themselves highest compared to other students in
 'Ability to work with others that are different than you' with a mean of 3.95. Overall
 respondents had a mean of 3.96 for the same item.
- 37% of Dentistry respondents plan to spend **more than 20 hours** 'preparing for class (studying reading, writing, doing homework or lab work, analyzing data, rehearsing, and other academic activities)' compared to 38% of Overall respondents.
- Top 5 reasons Dentistry respondents decided to attend IUPUI: 'Availability of specific
 academic programs (majors)','Graduates get good jobs', 'Career and job opportunities
 available in Indianapolis after I compete my degree', 'Opportunity for an IU or Purdue
 degree', and 'IUPUI's reputation'.
- The number one reason students chose their major was that 'graduates get good jobs.
- 72% of School of Dentistry respondents strongly agree 'it is important for me to graduate from IUPUI (e.g. rather than from another college) compared to 51% of the Overall Beginning Freshmen respondents.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS IN COMPARISONS BETWEEN SCHOOL OF DENTISTRY PRE-MAJOR RESPONDENTS AND ALL OTHER PRE-MAJOR RESPONDENTS

A means comparison analysis was conducted between the 2017 School of Dentistry pre-major respondents and all of the other 2017 pre-major respondents who took the Entering Student Survey. For four areas of questions a construct was formed to better analyze differences between the two groups. One of the four constructs were significant at the .05 level.








How committed are you to your current major?





What is the highest college degree you expect to obtain?




What is the likelihood that your will transfer from IUPUI to another college?
