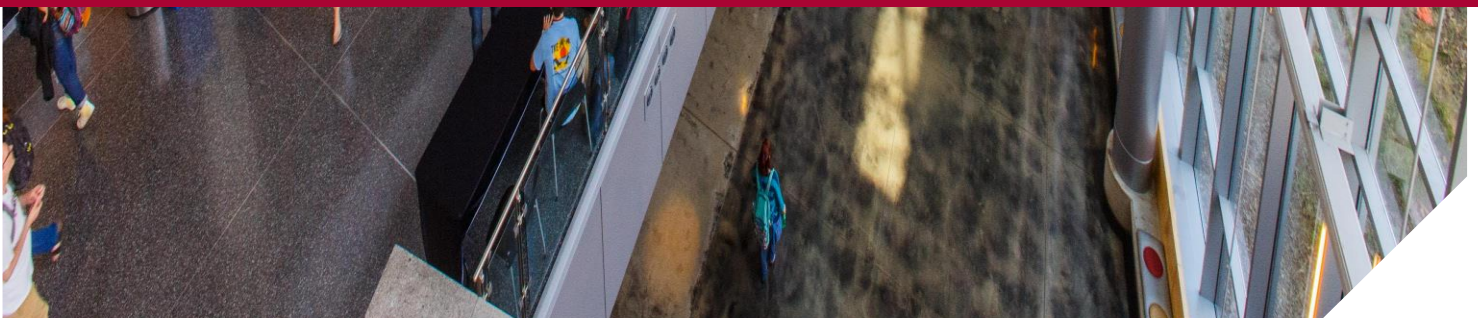

Welcome to the 2018 IUPUI Honors Entering Student Survey Report

The Entering Student Survey is a yearly survey administered during the first day of a student's orientation. The students are given the link to the survey during a dedicated block of time to ensure they have enough time to complete the survey. The survey is not required to be filled out, but students it is encouraged as some responses may be used to ensure they get information to resources to help them succeed in college. Of the 215 Honors beginning freshmen direct admits in the 2018 cohort, 156 completed the Entering Student Survey. That is a response rate of 73%.

IUPUI's Vision

To be a leading urban research institution recognized for the success of its students, its advances in health and life sciences, and its intellectual, economic, and cultural contributions to the well-being of the citizens of Indianapolis, the state of Indiana, and beyond.

Key Highlights Overall

- Compared to all other **direct-admit students**, Honors **direct-admit students** were more likely to rate themselves higher compared to other students in academic, mathematical, writing, study, and leadership ability. **Honors students** also rated themselves higher in likelihood to participate in clubs, campus events, service learning, a research project with a professor, study abroad, an internship, and overall be more satisfied with college life. They also rated themselves lower in experience stress balancing school with other responsibilities.
- **96%** of Honors respondents agree that the **IUPUI campus is welcoming**.
- **80%** of Honors respondents agreed **'I am proud to tell others I am going to school here.'**
- Honors direct-admit respondents rated themselves highest in their **'academic ability.'**
- **60%** of Honors respondents have at least **'Some'** concerns about their ability to finance their college education compared to 78% of Overall respondents reporting the same.
- **67%** of Honors direct-admits reported they plan to spend **more than 15 hours** 'preparing for class (studying, reading, writing, doing homework or lab work, analyzing data, rehearsing, and other academic activities)' compared to 51% of Overall respondents.
- Slightly more than two-thirds (**68%**) of Honors respondents reported a 'Very Good Chance' they will **be satisfied with college life**; compared to 58% of Overall respondents.
- Top 5 reasons Honors respondents reported choosing IUPUI were 'Availability of financial aid/scholarship', 'Availability of specific academic programs (majors)', 'Cost', 'Job, career, and internship opportunities available in Indianapolis after I complete my degree', and 'Graduates get good jobs'.
- The number one reason Honors direct-admit respondents chose their major was that **it is aligned with my skills and abilities**.
- Honors direct-admit respondents rated the availability of specific academic programs higher than Overall beginning freshmen respondents (mean 4.22 Honors, mean 3.95 Overall).

KEY HIGHLIGHTS IN COMPARISONS BETWEEN HONORS DIRECT ADMIT RESPONDENTS AND ALL OTHER BEGINNING FRESHMEN DIRECT-ADMIT RESPONDENTS

An independent sample t-test analysis was conducted between the 2018 Honors direct-admit respondents and the 2018 all other beginning freshmen direct-admit respondents who took the Entering Student Survey. For four areas of questions a construct was formed to better analyze differences between the two groups. Two of the four constructs were significant at the .05 level.

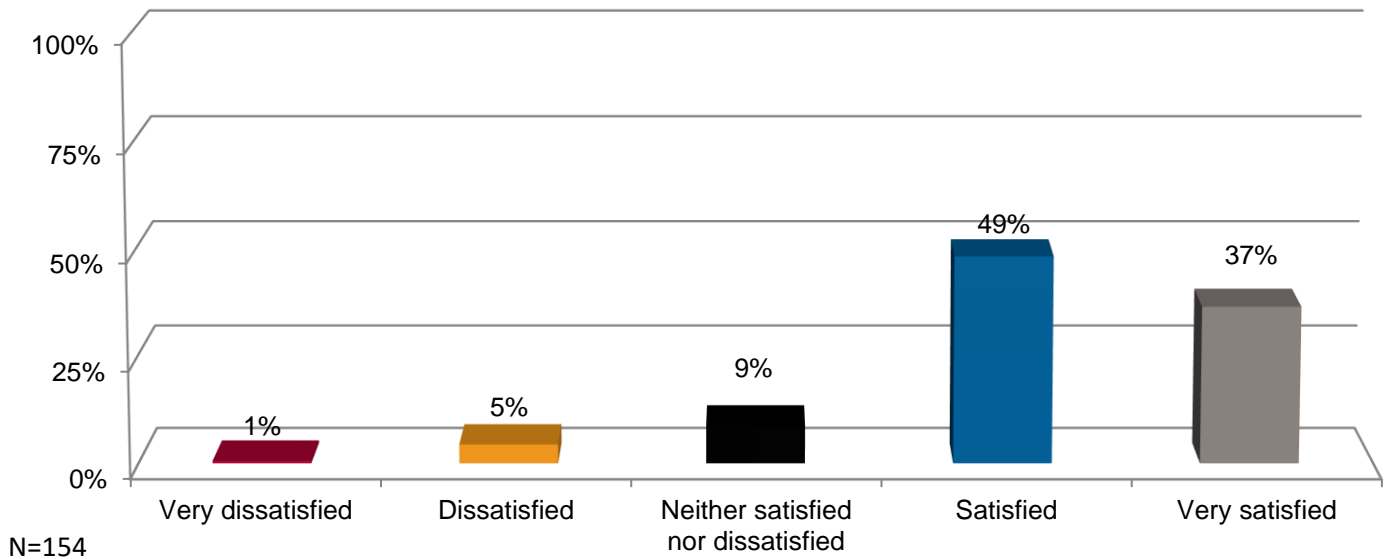

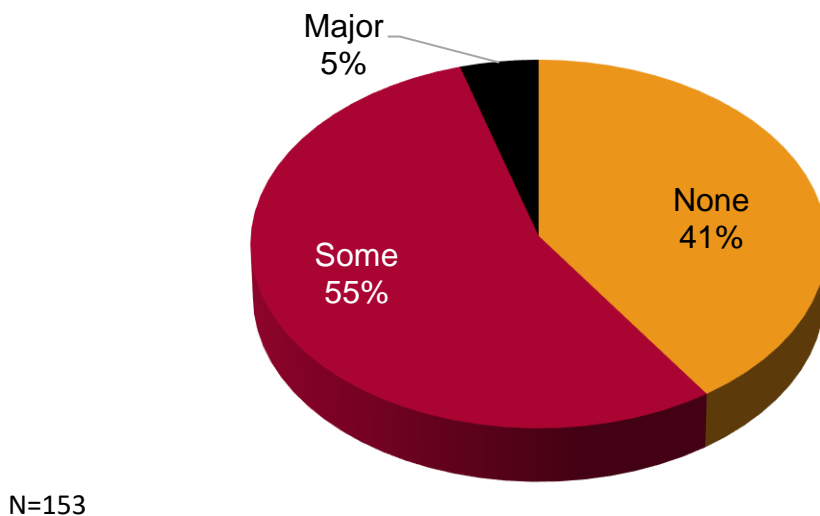

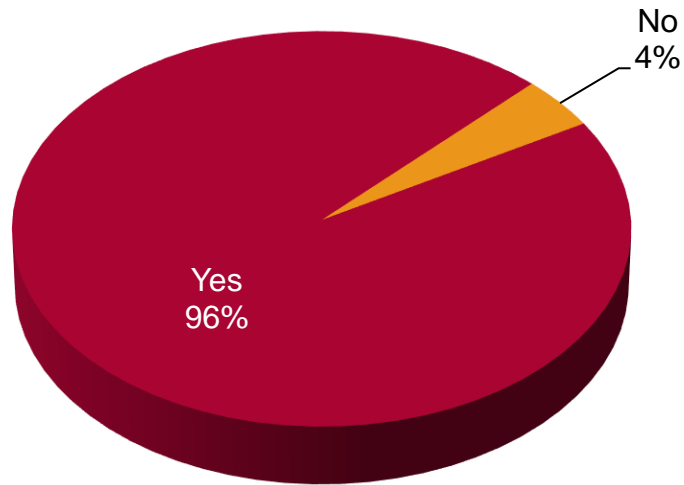

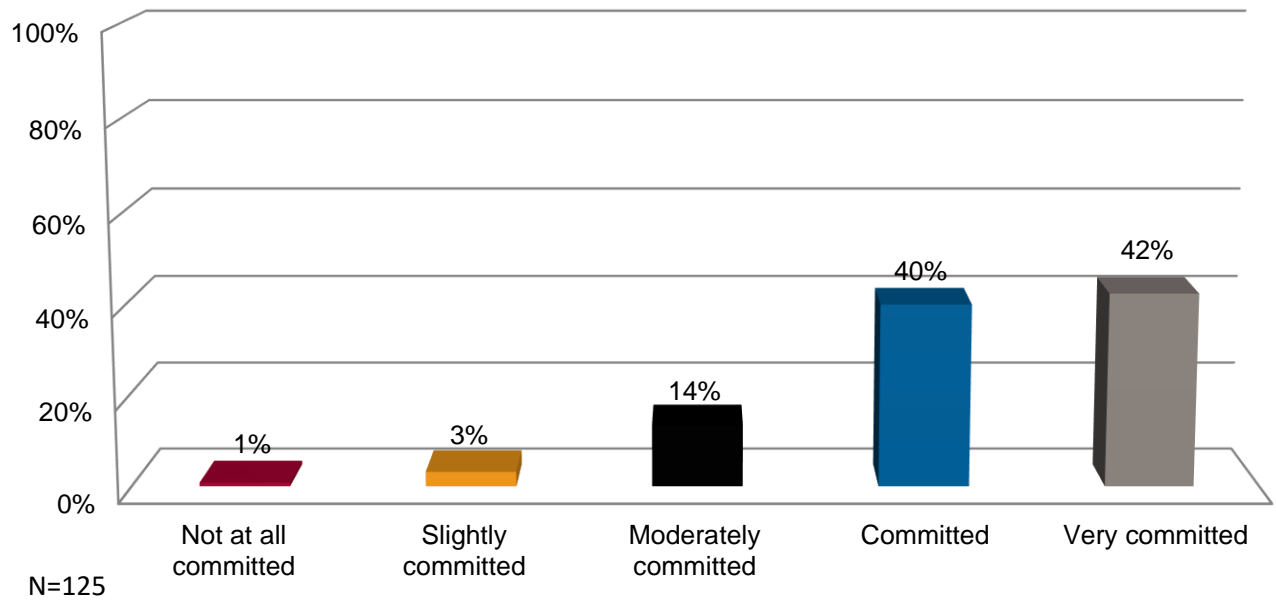

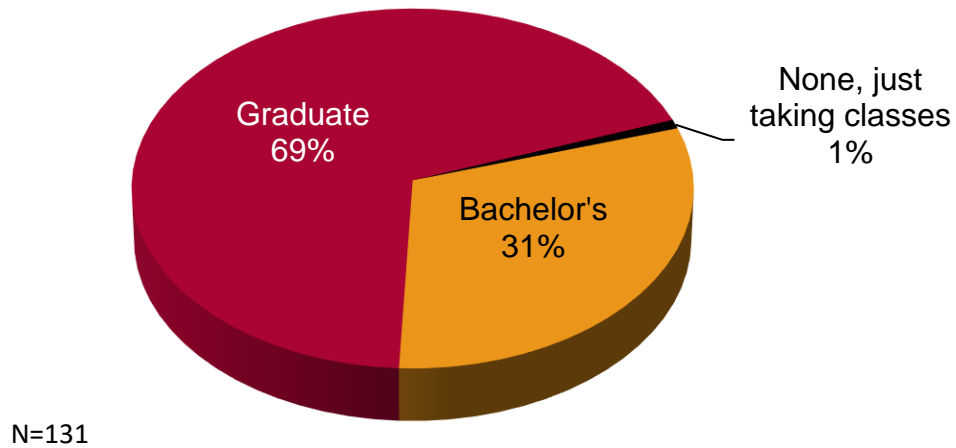

How committed are you to your current major?

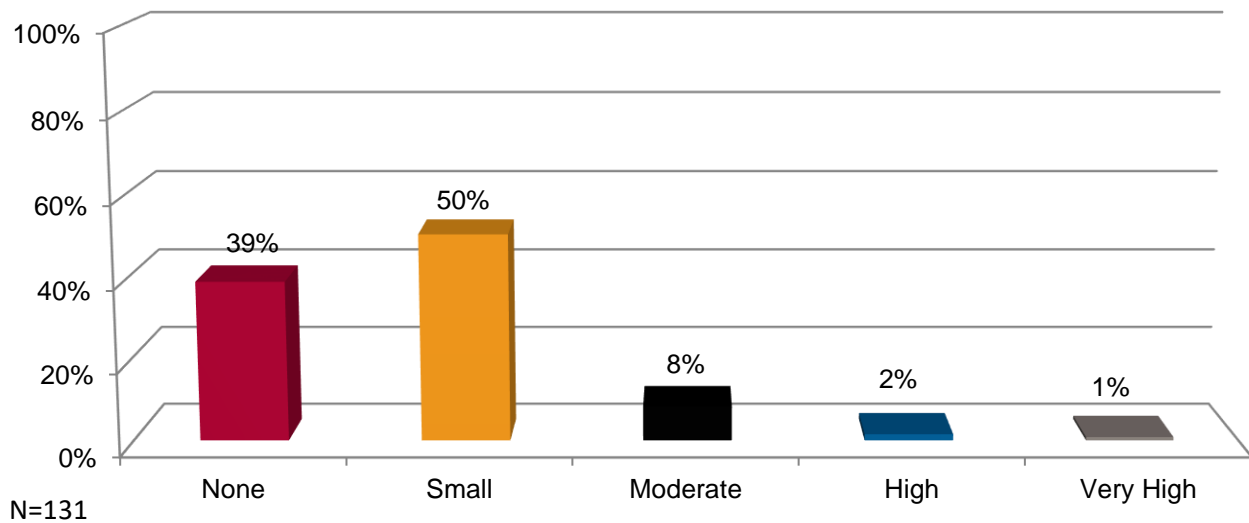

What is the highest degree you expect to obtain?

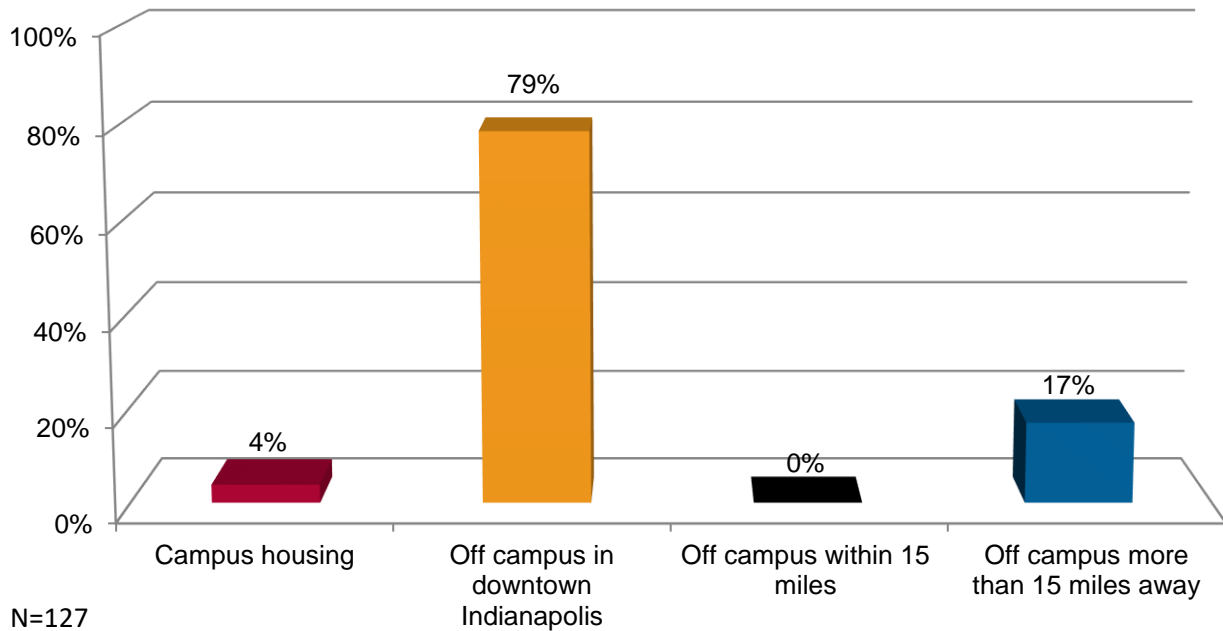


What is the likelihood that you will transfer from IUPUI to another college?

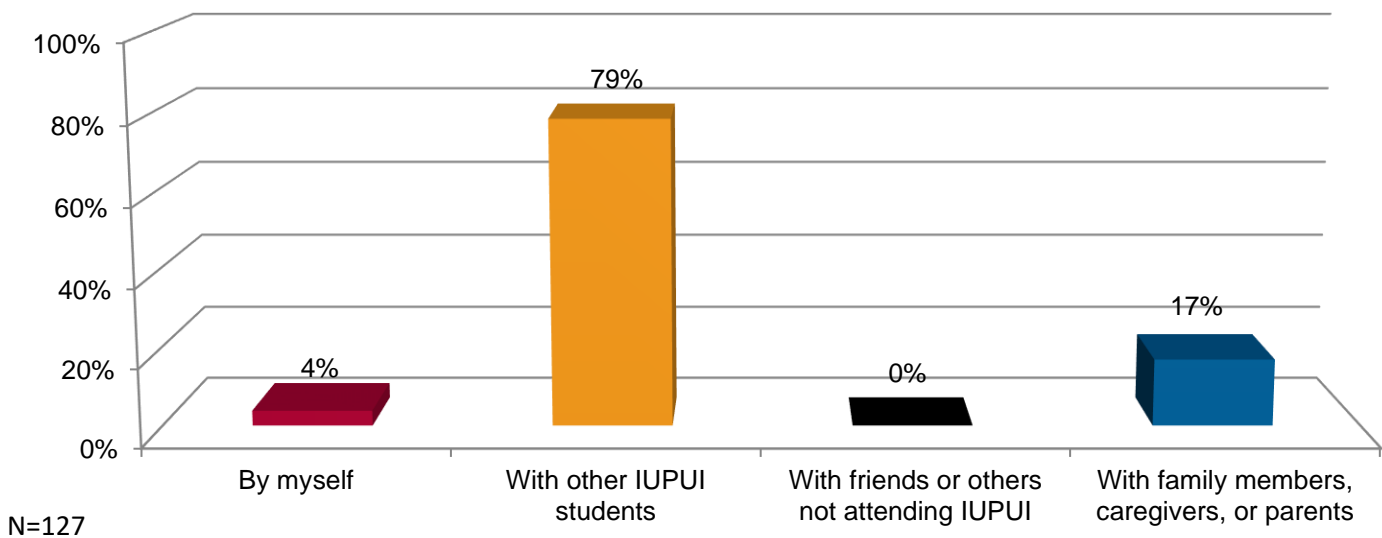


EXPECTED LIVING SITUATION
